MINISTRY



Together with the local Church, Wellspring Volunteers provide a hot meal and contribute/distribute toiletries and clothing to the homeless.

BWB provides families with healthy breakfasts, diapers, baby wipes, clothing, toys, and faith connections to families with babies who are economically disadvantaged in Carol Stream and the surrounding suburbs.

BCHC provides primary health care to the uninsured while sharing the love of Jesus. The patients are low-income residents of west Chicago-land. Many are first-generation Americans, primarily from Hispanic countries.

Christmas Sharing is a community wide effort to bring a Merry Christmas to hundreds of in-need families as identified by social workers in the Wheaton and Warrenville school districts.

Jubilee recycles and resells donated furniture with proceeds supporting Outreach Community Ministries. Outreach operates neighborhood counseling, transitional housing and employment training centers.

WHAT CAN I DO?



Volunteers can help in three ways: by purchasing food for the meal, by preparing food for the meal (usually at church after the second service) and/or by serving the meal in Albany Park (vans leave the church at 3pm and return around 7pm).

Volunteers serve with set-up/clean up, parking directions, guest sign-in, taking & packing diaper orders, packing breakfast foods, hosting the clothing & toy areas, guiding guests as a personal shopper, and by donating pre-packaged breakfast foods.

BCHC is in need of Medical Providers and Specialists, Nurses, Medical Assistants, Translators, Nutritionists, Physical Therapists, those who can clean the Clinic and Prayer Team Members to cover the patients in prayer.

Guideline may change, but typical donations for the invited families include toys, clothes and gift cards to purchase food. Volunteers are needed to collect, sort and distribute these gifts for in-person or drive-through giving.

Volunteer groups become a fun, fast-paced team of Warehouse and Truck Assistants who move furniture on and off the display floor and help load purchases into customers' vehicles.

SCHEDULE



We serve the 4th Sunday of each month.

Events are the 3rd Saturday of every month from 7am-9:30am.

The Health Center is open for patient visits every Monday, Wednesday and Friday evenings from 7pm-9pm. Several day shifts are also available.

Donations are received in November. Distribution occurs in December.

Schedule is 12-4:15pm on Saturdays, with two additional shifts 9am-1:30pm and 1:30pm to 6pm (based on volunteer attendance).
